

STRUCTURED PLAY FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

1. What types of play are offered?

Please see the current schedule on the large bulletin board by court 4 for a complete listing. There are currently the following options: Novice Partner Switch, Partner Switch, Skill Level Play, 4.0-5.0 Challenge Play, Women's, and Singles.

2. What is Partner Switch?

Partner Switch means you will play with a randomly assigned partner each game. This is determined by a number you are assigned when you check in. Your partners will also be randomly assigned. The goal is to have fun playing with a multitude of partners and opponents of varied skill levels in a structured play setting. Up to 7 games are played. Players need to stay and play the entire session so that other players are not without partners.

3. What if I have physical limitations and can't play for the entire time?

For some structured play events (novice, partner switch, women's), if another player is willing, you may "share a number" and play every other game. For Skill Level Play and 4.0-5.0 Skill Level play, players may take breaks as needed.

4. What is Skill Level Play?

Skill Level play offers players of the same skill level to play together in competitive games. Monday and Wednesday sessions are designed for players with a 3.0-4.0 rating. Players are allowed to assign their own skill rating and play in open play, or other agreed upon formats, such as "challenge."

5. How does Skill Level Challenge Play (Fridays) differ from Skill Level Play (Monday and Wednesdays)?

4.0 -5.0 Challenge Play is for the very best players here at the Voyager who have a 4.0 USAPA rating or who have previously played in a 4.0 skill bracket in a tournament.

6. Do I need to sign up in advance?

No, no sessions require advance sign up. However, you must arrive on time in order to play.
